I. PROPOSAL INTRODUCTION

The following proposal has been prepared by Royal Roads University for City University of Macau for the purpose of showcasing our suite of summer programs for 2018 in Victoria, BC, Canada. The proposed programs highlight different summer educational experiences for students from City University of Macau to consider as part of our open-enrolment summer programs. These programs are designed for the participants to learn and experience English language training and Canadian culture through classroom work, guest speakers, off-campus site visits, and through optional weekend excursions. The interests chosen will immerse the participants in leadership or tourism, business/management, and other transferable subject areas.



ROYAL ROADS UNIVERSITY:

II. TEACHING AND LEARNING MODEL:

As a uniquely mandated public university, Royal Roads University is charged with offering education in professional fields that is sensitive to labour market needs. Faculty who work from interdisciplinary, social science perspectives guide applied participant research; practitioner-scholars engage participants in experiential learning. Career sector needs inform course learning outcomes; a cohort of peers encourages networking and enables participants to work in teams. The best research in modern learning theory suggests that fundamental change to the traditional approach to learning and teaching is needed. Royal Roads is guided by two frameworks. III. VICTORIA, BRITISH COLUMBIA, CANADA:

Royal Roads University is in Victoria, the capital city of British Columbia, on the southern tip of Vancouver Island. It has easy access to the mainland with Vancouver, Whistler and Seattle (USA) in close proximity.

Founded in 1843, today's Victoria has grown from its very early English origins into a city filled with sophisticated, international flavor and spectacular natural beauty. It's a place where the casual modernism of the West Coast blends with time-honored British, European, First Nations and Asian traditions.

Boasting the mildest climate in Canada, spectacular natural beauty, year round outdoor activities, entertainment and world-renowned attractions, it's no wonder that Vancouver Island, where Victoria is located, is rated the **Top Island** in the Continental US and Canada, and one of the **Top Ten Islands In The World** by the 2012 Travel+Leisure World's Best Awards. Victoria was even rated as the #1 **Destination to Visit in Canada** by the 2010 TripAdvisor Travelers' Choice Awards.

IV. PROGRAM OBJECTIVES:

Our objective is to provide City University of Macau's students an opportunity to complete a learning experience in one of Canada's most recognized universities. In our unique programs, each delivered over four-weeks, participants will advance their competencies and skills by completing the respective program expectations highlighted in this proposal. Each program has unique outcomes, but many are common across the offerings, including an increased awareness and understanding of Canadian culture and learning style as delivered from Royal Roads University staff and faculty.

V. PROGRAM OPTIONS:

1. Summer English Experience (SEE) programs

SEE programs are non-credit programs specifically designed to give undergraduate students a chance to "SEE" and experience the language and culture of Victoria. Students will gain international experience and cross-cultural skills while improving their English communication skills. Based on an experiential learning model, this program actively engages students in class and on activities to provide a fun and integrated learning experience. Canadian workplace culture, networking, and career planning are the pillars of the programs. Two SEE programs are offered – SEE Leadership and SEE Tourism.

SEE Leadership – July 16 to August 10, 2018

The SEE Leadership program includes activities that showcase the natural splendor of Vancouver Island while students engage in meaningful lessons. Students will learn from and in nature to develop leadership abilities while improving their English. Sample schedule provided in Appendix 1.

The feedback we received from our SEE Leadership 2017 delivery was very positive. Students had tremendous fun learning with and from participants from all around the world. When asked what students liked most about the program, we received comments such as "I really enjoyed everything", "the opportunity to meet people from all over the world", and "experimenting the Canadian culture".



SEE Tourism - August 13 to September 7, 2018

The SEE Tourism program offers a unique look into the Vancouver Island hospitality sector and workplace culture. Students will be immersed in the thriving tourism industry on Vancouver Island while learning about Canadian workplace culture and the hospitality sector. Students will meet working professionals as they enjoy world class tourist destinations in the region. Sample schedule provided in Appendix 2.

Minimum Requirements

Mid to upper-level English language comprehension in both written and verbal skills; undergraduate student 19+

VI. ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS:

While there are a variety of accommodation options are available in Victoria, below are options which may be of interest and work well with the program offerings.

<u>Homestay</u>: Royal Roads University works with Canadian Homestay International to match students with culturally appropriate homestay families. The Homestay option includes: a private room with bed, desk and reading light; home-cooked meals, 24 hour emergency phone number; opportunities to practice English and to participate in weekend family excursions.

VII. PROGRAM COST:

The following estimated costs are for all participants in any of the open-enrolment programs offered. If you have a large group (more than 10) with an interest in any one program, there is a discount (dependent on the final number in the group) that we are prepared to offer. Prices are quoted in Canadian dollars and are subject to change at any time. A final quote will be provided once program(s) have been selected.
